


Knee vs Ground

- · Bruised knee, first aid

Causal Factor	Corrective Action	
Physical Shortcut (path taken was fastest route vs safer route)	Address paths of travel on THA especially when the path is affected Workers to avoid shortcuts	
No delineation/barricading	Implement barricades or signage when routes are affected, if practicable


No significant injury or death, **inadequate** controls in place.


No significant injury or death, adequate controls in place.





NON-STCKY significant injury or death would not likely have occurred

Twisted ankle while walking on an uneven surface





An object fell into an uncontrolled area and nearly hit someone.



STCKY INJURY

significant injury or death **did** occur


A person fell from an elevated surface and struck their head, causing a traumatic brain injury.



STCKY LUCK

no significant injury or death, **inadequate** controls in place

A suspended load fell into a non-controlled zone, nearly striking personnel.



STCKY SUCCESS

no significant injury or death, **adequate** controls in place

While standing on a steel beam, a worker slipped and fell. Their fall protection engaged and arrested the fall.


