





Triangle Fire Memorial

- Triangle Shirtwaist Factory fire in New York City in 1911 led to the creation of ASSP later that year.
- Triangle Fire Memorial constructed in 2023 on original building in Manhattan to honor 146 victims, led by Remember the Triangle Fire Coalition.
- Stainless-steel ribbon descends from 9th floor where most deaths occurred. It splits horizontally at street level where victims' names are stenciled into ribbon.
- ASSP and the ASSP Foundation donated to the project and appear on a building plaque.

Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI)

- ASSP is committed to a culture in which everyone's experiences, perspectives and identities are honored, respected and celebrated.
- Society Operating Guideline on DEI was revised.
- Improvements made to processes around ASSP nominations and elections as well as the selection of event speakers and instructors.
- Virtual DEI Summit last year brought hundreds of professionals together to learn how to advance DEI in occupational safety and health.
- ASSP Foundation programs refocused on a broader reach to support the greater community through policy updates and new initiatives.

Position on Child Labor

- ASSP opposes all forms of exploitative child labor and supports legislation and regulation that address such practices.
- Because much of child labor is hidden, accurate data is difficult to obtain.
- International Labor Organization estimates 22,000 children are killed at work each year.
- ASSP supports reasonable approaches to young people working and experiencing the benefits and responsibilities of having a job.



A10.50 Heat Stress Management Standard

- Heat stress can cause heat exhaustion and heat stroke, which can be fatal. Over 400 worker deaths from environmental heat exposure since 2011.
- In February, ASSP published first national voluntary consensus standard addressing heat stress for construction and demolition workers.
- Explains how to give workers proper rest, water breaks and shade while meeting business needs.
- Guidance can be adapted for any outdoor job.
