### Proposed Rules: Heat Injury and Illness Prevention in Outdoor and Indoor Work Settings

OSHA is proposing a new standard, titled Heat Injury and Illness Prevention in Outdoor and Indoor Work Settings, which would apply to all employers in General Industry, Construction, Maritime, and Agriculture sectors under OSHA's jurisdiction, with some exceptions. This programmatic standard would require employers to develop a plan to evaluate and control heat hazards in the workplace, clearly outlining employer obligations and necessary measures to protect employees from hazardous heat. OSHA is seeking comments on all aspects of the proposed rule by December 30th, 2024, and will schedule an informal public hearing if requested during the comment period, with details to be announced in the Federal Register. ## California State Motor Vehicle Pollution Control Standards; Advanced Clean Fleets Regulation; Request for Waiver of Preemption and Authorization; Opportunity for Public Hearing and Public Comment

The California Air Resources Board (CARB) has informed the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) about its adoption of Advanced Clean Fleets (ACF) regulations. These regulations apply to various fleets, including state and local government fleets, drayage truck fleets, federal agency fleets, and large commercial fleets, requiring the incorporation of zero-emitting vehicles starting in 2024. Additionally, all new California-certified medium- and heavy-duty vehicle sales must be zero-emitting by 2036. Written comments must be received on or before September 16th, 2024. The ASSP Career Center is a free comprehensive resource available to all ASSP Chapter members who are looking for a job or those who are employed and want to advance their safety careers. The Career Center's Job Seeker Resource Center offers resume writing tips, tools to build your resume online, and a Resume Bank where you can post your resume anonymously for employers to view, except for your name and contact information. But that's not all! You also get interview preparation and follow-up strategies, such as how to bring up and negotiate a salary.

The Job Board lets you to search for job postings throughout the US and internationally by applying filters that fit your criteria, and save them by keyword, location, industry, or job function. The Job Alert automated search sends new postings that meet your criteria right to you, instead of having to log in to search for new jobs. You also get help with career advancement to move your career forward or change industry sectors, including using social media for networking, how to work effectively with recruiters, how to give notice, and negotiating salary and benefits. And you have access to expert coaching!

#### MONTHLY CHAPTER MEETING, OCTOBER 8

### Riskonomics - Improving Results with Effective Risk Management Rick Fineman, CSP, VP of Loss Control for Berkshire Hathaway Homestate Companies

At our October breakfast meeting, Rick Fineman will provide a high level overview of risk in the workplace and explain how to quantify risk to measure results and provide best practices to move from reacting to hazards to reducing risk by engaging employees at every level of an organization. He will define risk and its characteristics, differentiating between organizational and individual risk and why that is important. From there, he explains how to assess the varying degrees of risk in order to permit educated decision making, ultimately reducing the level of risk that is accepted. This presentation is a valuable tool to use in assessing any working environment and identifying key areas to address.

Rick has worked in the safety profession for 38 years and has held various management roles over that time. Currently the VP and GM at BHHC Insurance in San Diego, his prior roles include VP & Manager of Risk for ICW Group, Safety Director for the Port of Tacoma, Risk Manager for Research to Reality Group, and Regional VP of Underwriting and Distribution for Liberty Mutual. Rick holds Bachelors of Science Degrees in Chemistry and in Occupational Safety and Health and has completed graduate work in toxicology. Rick has presented at various state and national conferences, including the NSC Safety Congress and The American Society of Safety. He also sits on several advisory boards including ANSI Code committees, the MākuSafe® Wearable Technology Advisory Board, and the BCSP test question development group.

Biden-Harris administration's proposed rule to protect indoor, outdoor workers from extreme heat's dangers opens for public comment

August 30, 2024

**WASHINGTON** — The U.S. DOL today announced the opening of the public comment period for its proposed rule intended to protect millions of workers from the significant health risks of extreme heat and its publication in the Federal Register.

Announced in July 2024 by the department's Occupational Safety and Health Administration, the rule – if finalized – would help protect approximately 36 million workers in indoor and outdoor work settings and substantially reduce workplace heat injuries, illnesses and fatalities.

OSHA encourages public participation in the rulemaking process as it will help the agency develop a final rule that adequately protects workers, is feasible for employers and is based on the best available evidence.

Submit comments to Docket Number OSHA -2021-0009. Directions on how to submit comments are included in the Federal Register notice. OSHA anticipates holding a public hearing after the close of the written comment period, with details to be announced.

DOL, Mexican Embassy kick off Labor Rights Week 2024, commemorate Consular Partnership Program's 20th anniversary

August 23, 2024

**WASHINGTON** – U.S. Department of Labor officials and representatives from the Mexican Embassy and other diplomatic missions joined today to mark Labor Rights Week 2024 with an event promoting migrant workers' rights and how the department is safeguarding these rights.

Co-sponsored by the Embassy of Mexico, the event included remarks from department leaders, U.S. government officials, Mexican Ambassador Esteban Moctezuma, and Mexican Ministry of Foreign Affairs' Chief Officer for North America Roberto Velasco Alvarez.

At the event, the department commemorated the 20th anniversary of the Consular Partnership Program by renewing its agreement with Mexico. The program began in 2004 to educate Mexicans working in the U.S. about their rights and reminding employers of their responsibilities. In addition to Mexico, the program now includes agreements with more countries throughout Latin America.

"Celebrating the 20th anniversary of the Consular Partnership Program is an important milestone. The agreement stands as a beacon of cooperation and shared commitment to protecting the rights of migrant workers," said Deputy Undersecretary for International Affairs Thea Lee. "The program is a powerful tool for ensuring every worker, regardless of their status or background, is treated with the dignity and respect they deserve."

Assistant Secretary for Occupational Safety and Health Douglas L. Parker, Wage and Hour Administrator Jessica Looman, Deputy Undersecretary for International Affairs Thea Lee, Assistant Secretary for Employee Benefits Security Lisa M. Gomez, Assistant Secretary for Employment and Training Jose Rodriguez and National Labor Relations Board Associate General Counsel Jessica Rutter participated in the event.

During Labor Rights Week 2024, from Aug. 26 to Aug. 30, a series of outreach events

will focus on issues including migrant workers' rights, unsafe and unhealthy working and living conditions, working in extreme heat, retaliation and fair wages. In 2009, the Mexican Embassy launched Labor Rights Week which now includes participation by the department's enforcement agencies, the NLRB and EEOC.

"Every worker, no matter where they're from or what language they speak, has the right to know and claim their rights to a safe and healthy workplace. Too often, migrant workers face barriers that make this difficult, whether it's a language they are still learning or a system they are still navigating. But let's be clear: these rights are not just privileges for some - they are fundamental rights of every worker in this country," said Assistant Secretary for Occupational Safety and Health Douglas L. Parker. "That's why we're partnering with consulates, labor unions, worker advocates, and community leaders to break down these barriers, to ensure that every worker receives the fair treatment they deserve."

"Collaborating with foreign consulates allows us to engage with immigrant and migrant workers about the critical federal labor protections the Wage and Hour Division enforces, including protecting worker's wages, as well as their health and safety on farms," said Wage and Hour Administrator Jessica Looman. "We are also committed to protecting young workers, who our investigators have found often sadly fall victim to some of the worst child labor abuses."

"Today's renewed agreement with the government of Mexico solidifies the Employee Benefits Security Administration's commitment to ensuring workers of all backgrounds and nationalities, regardless of immigration status, know they enjoy protection under federal law for work-related benefits," said Assistant Secretary for Employee Benefits Security Lisa M. Gomez.
